






NORTH CAROLINA BREASTFEEDING SNAPSHOT





Submission of a detailed budget and budget narrative


 The proposed budget will be reviewed in detail and negotiated to ensure that it meets the goals and objectives of the project













GROWTH OF THE BREASTFEEDING PEER COUNSELOR PROGRAM


BREASTFEEDING PEER COUNSELOR PROGRAM FISCAL YEAR 2009-2010




BREASTFEEDING PEER COUNSELOR PROGRAM FISCAL YEAR 2018-2019














INFANTS RECEIVING <u>FULLY</u> BREASTFEEDING FOOD PACKAGE FFY 2012




INFANTS RECEIVING <u>FULLY</u> BREASTFEEDING FOOD PACKAGE FFY 2016



INFANTS RECEIVING ANY BREASTFEEDING FOOD PACKAGE FFY 2012












