BREASTFEEDING IN WIC

Alabama WIC breastfeeding initiation rates increased by 2 percent between 2010 and 2020.

Among WIC infants who initiated breastfeeding in Alabama in 2020, **7 percent** continued breastfeeding at 6 months.



Fruit and Vegetable Benefit: Congress enhanced WIC's fruit and vegetable benefit to align with scientific recommendations. Current monthly benefit amounts are \$26 for children, \$47 for pregnant and postpartum participants, and \$52 for breastfeeding participants. In FY 2023, WIC provided an estimated \$30.8M in fruit and vegetable benefits to **82,712** participants in Alabama.

CHILDHOOD OBESITY IN WIC IN ALABAMA

There was no significant change in the obesity rate among WIC toddlers in Alabama between 2010 and 2020.
