Among WIC infants who initiated breastfeeding in California in 2020, 33 percent continued breastfeeding at 6 months.



Fruit and Vegetable Benefit: Congress enhanced WIC's fruit and vegetable benefit to align with scientific recommendations. Current monthly benefit amounts are \$26 for children, \$47 for pregnant and postpartum participants, and \$52 for breastfeeding participants. In FY 2023, WIC provided an estimated \$287.2M in fruit and vegetable benefits to **785,718** participants in California.
