#### **BREASTFEEDING IN WIC**

Louisiana WIC breastfeeding initiation rates increased by 56 percent between 2010 and 2018.





Fruit and Vegetable Benefit: Congress enhanced WIC's fruit and vegetable benefit to align with scientific recommendations. Current monthly benefit amounts are \$26 for children, \$47 for pregnant and postpartum participants, and \$52 for breastfeeding participants. In FY 2023, WIC provided an estimated \$25.4M in fruit and vegetable benefits to 64,318 participants in Louisiana.

# CHILDHOOD OBESITY IN WIC IN LOUISIANA

There was no significant change in the obesity rate among WIC toddlers in Louisiana between 2010 and 2020.
