# **BREASTFEEDING IN WIC**

The Pueblo of San Felipe WIC breastfeeding initiation rates increased by **58 percent** between 2000 and 2020.

2000	58%
2020	92%

Among WIC infants who initiated breastfeeding in the Pueblo of San Felipe in 2020, **35 percent** continued breastfeeding at 6 months.

# CHILDHOOD OBESITY IN WIC IN THE PUEBLO OF SAN FELIPE

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**Fruit and Vegetable Benefit:** Congress enhanced WIC's fruit and vegetable benefit to align with scientific recommendations. Current monthly benefit amounts are \$26 for children, \$47 for pregnant and postpartum participants, and \$52 for breastfeeding participants. In FY 2023, WIC provided an estimated **\$58,085** in fruit and vegetable benefits to **159** participants in the Pueblo of San Felipe.
